Wilmington is the largest and most populous city in the state of Delaware. It sits at the confluence of the Christina River and Brandywine River, near where the Christina flows into the Delaware River. It is the county seat of New Castle County and one of the major cities in the Delaware Valley metropolitan area. As of the 2018 U.S. census estimate, the city's population is 70,635.




DOVER, DE
